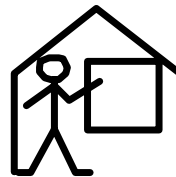

#### **Golf Day - Fundraising Campaign**

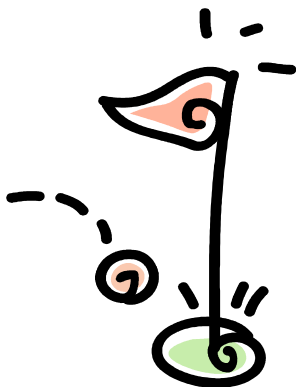
Lorraine Hobbs -our fundraiser has been hard at work organising a golf tournament as part of our fund raising campaign.

The Redway School is a mixed day school for pupils aged between 2-19 with a wide range of Severe and complex learning difficulties. In addition to their learning difficulties the pupils have other needs associated with Physical disabilities, medical conditions and Autistic spectrum disorder. The school will be holding its first Open Charity Golf Day (all are welcome), on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> June 2010 at the "Three Locks Golf Club".

The tournament is a Stapleford, four-ball, better ball competition, using the best two scores on each hole to count. In order to add a bit of fun, for £10 each – max 2 per player, "Mulligans" can be purchased during registration.

The cost will be £180.00 per team (£45 per player) this will include bacon rolls and coffee during team registration, a round of golf followed by hot food for all players.

Tee off will start at 9.30 so PLEASE register sixty minutes before.

Prizes will be awarded to the first two teams with the best scores, and prizes for the longest drive, and nearest pin.

There will also be a raffle and charity auction.

A deposit of £50 will secure a place for your team, with the balance to be paid by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2010, alternatively, if you prefer, a post dated cheque for the full amount will be welcome.
