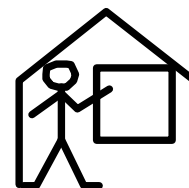

A few weeks ago we visited Milton Keynes Art Gallery. The exhibition was by an artist called Gareth Jones and was inspired by his teenage years in Milton Keynes. The exhibition was displayed across three rooms; Room One contained a 3D paper sculpture; Room Two displayed a slide show of early photographs of Milton Keynes; and Room Three was a very large space with pages from magazines displayed. In this room the artist wanted viewers to express themselves in their own way; we did this by making sounds which echoed around the space. We also explored the sculpture garden outside the gallery which contained lots of shiny metal shapes; all of the students were able to encounter them in their own way. We all had a wonderful visit.

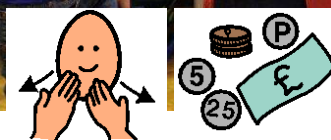


## Fundraising News
